In light of this, let me plead with you to not lose heart. While this season is far from over, we are continuing to reevaluate our plans and policies to protect the wellbeing of every member. Our schedule may not be what it once was, and there may be ministries that are delayed in their return, but do not become a statistic. Your soul, your family and your future need the church and the church and its future needs you. I am praying for each and every one of you, that the Lord will renew us and strengthen us for the days ahead. Second Baptist has defied the odds to date in many ways, but let us not grow weary in doing good. Let us press on and keep our eyes on Christ.
