FROM THE PASTOR

While this past Sunday's sermon was on our need to cultivate joy in our lives, there was plenty to be joyful about in both services. We had over 10 first-time visitors, powerful worship, baptism, another new member and our biggest attendance since our regathering began. While we continue to rejoice in all of these positive things, we find ourselves still facing a long uphill climb to normalcy. There is still a large segment of our church family who are uncomfortable attending in person services, due to the increase in positive Covid-19 cases. Over the past few weeks, the deacons and myself have met to pray through our next step as a church. While the original plan was to reconvene a normal schedule on August 2, we have agreed to delay that plan until September. Firstly, we know of at least 8 members or active attenders who have had or currently have Covid-19. While none of these individuals have attended services while positive, it is a reminder how a positive case can happen and its potential impact. Therefore, we would rather maintain social distance guidelines and the inconvenience of limited services than be forced to shut down for two weeks and rely on digital worship only. Secondly, we looked at the fact that schools will be restarting at the beginning of August. Our hope is to monitor the case numbers over the first two weeks of school and reevaluate our long-term plans after. If case numbers do not increase proportionately, we will follow suit and reintroduce a normal schedule following Labor Day. So, in light of these considerations and more, we unanimously agree to extend our current service schedule until September 13th with the following adjustments.

- 1. Nursery: We have spent the previous month cleaning, sanitizing and implementing new CDC approved guidelines for nursery care. Beginning Sunday, August 9 we will make childcare available for both the 8:30 and 10:15 service. We ask all parents to go online and reserve the service time that you plan to attend during the month of August. This will help us recruit and plan for volunteer workers appropriately.
- Children: At this time will not be offering children's church until after Labor Day. We will be reevaluating Wednesday activities in mid-August, as well. Our hope is that you will make the commitment to attend worship with your children. Services last 1 hour and provide an opportunity to model the importance of worship as a family. The gym renovation should be completed in mid-August and will serve as a large venue for children's church and activities that maintain social distancing.
- 3. Youth: Beginning August 2, our student ministry will promote students and maintain an adequately spaced worship experience on Sunday evenings at 5:00 PM.
- Choir: After taking survey of current choir members, we have made the decision to 4 delay choir practice and participation until after Labor Day. However, we may utilize some members spaced out in the choir loft later in August. The purpose would be to lead in worship with the praise team but not perform special music selections.
- Life Groups: We will continue to offer socially distanced spaces for classes to meet 5. throughout the week. Our greatest concern is placing groups in confined rooms that don't allow for spacing. This scenario is our largest hurdle to restarting a normal schedule this fall. Continue to maintain contact with your Life Group leader for weekly schedule and location.

I again want to thank you for your patience and support through these difficult days. Let me remind you that while many of our traditions have been affected or canceled due to Covid-19, the church is alive and well. Our biblical convictions have not ceased nor has our commitment to fulfill the great commission. May we rejoice in this good news while accepting these temporary changes.
