Being at home on a Sunday night is not unbiblical, nor detrimental to my spiritual growth. I am not at risk of losing blessing nor commitment by the absence of such a service. Ultimately, this transition is essential to the health of our church. Our entire staff and active deacon body supports such a decision. While ultimately you will decide this Sunday what is right for you, I hope you know that regardless of the outcome, our church will continue to grow and honor the Lord.
