EDUCATION

Can I be honest? I don't envy Pastor Justin. For nine months he has faithfully and painstakingly guided our church through a pandemic. From the decision to go virtual in the spring, to regathering in the summer, to starting and pausing and trying to plan and understanding what can't be planned— each step he has sought wise counsel and made the decisions he felt were in the best interest of the church. I have been a part of that counsel, but haven't had the burden of making the final call. Now, as he takes a well-deserved sabbatical, those guiding decisions lie with myself and our staff. It is quite a heavy responsibility.

This week we met as a staff to discuss how and when to begin ministries in the church again. We agreed that the best strategy is to open everything up at the same time rather than beginning different ministries at different times. We believe a full reopening, rather than a staggered opening, will be more easily communicated and shared with the church.

Over the next week I'll contact several of our ministry leaders and volunteers to discuss what date everyone is most comfortable with starting back. With the cases in the county as they stand today and with the Governor's executive order in effect until January 19th, we feel it is not wise to start back in the next couple of weeks. Our desire is to focus in on sometime in early February. That will allow time for the governor's order to expire, any Christmas/New Year's surge in cases to run their course, and hopefully an increase in vaccinations to take effect. After these conversations, I hope to have more clarity on a reopening date and will share with you in the coming weeks. As with every decision so far, that date can change depending on any unforeseen circumstances.

In order for our restart to be successful, we need more volunteers. In any normal time, each ministry of the church could use a few extra hands. In the times we are in now, each ministry desperately needs all hands on deck. Whether it's volunteers who get sick, volunteers who get quarantined due to cases at home, or volunteers who need to be extra cautious against infection, every ministry will experience times where a volunteer will be absent and someone will need to step up. With that in mind, I want to call on each of you who are not volunteering in a ministry to pray over where you could serve. Maybe you have the desire to serve but aren't sure what opportunity is right for you. The greater base of volunteers we have, the better chance we have to maintain ministry in the coming weeks.

We welcome Dr. Randy C. Davis as our speaker for this Sunday, January 10. Davis became the executive director of the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board in 2010 (formerly Executive Board of the Tennessee Baptist Convention) after 34 years of pastoral ministry, serving churches in Mississippi and Tennessee. Forever a pastor at heart, Davis feels most blessed that more than 100 young men under his leadership have entered the ministry during that time.

Davis has a passion for evangelism, discipleship and stewardship. Both FBC Morristown, Tenn., and FBC Sevierville, Tenn., increased annual Cooperative Program giving to approximately 10 percent

during his ministry at those respective churches while contributions to both the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering and the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering also significantly increased under his leadership.

Davis is a graduate of William Carey College, Hattiesburg, Miss.; New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, New Orleans, La.; and Southern Baptist Center for Biblical Studies, Jacksonville, Fla. He has served as a board of trustee member for the International Mission Board and two Baptist universities. Davis and wife, Jeanne, have two adult daughters, Wendy and Beth, and four grandchildren.

How would you define a biblical, God-honoring marriage? The answer is found in God's Word from the One who created marriage, ordained marriage, and by His grace sustains marriage. Like I told my counseling trainees this week when I asked them to define who God is, all of their answers were right, but different to some degree. Likewise, if I asked you to define marriage, most of you would give relevant principles and texts that define a Biblical God-honoring marriage that would be similar but different. Let me give you three keys to a biblical marriage: 1) The husband is *loving* and *leading* his family spiritually, financially, emotionally, etc. 2) The wife is *respecting* her husband's leadership 3) The marriage itself is a *picture* of the gospel. My goal these next 5 weeks beginning this coming Sunday, January 10 leading up to Valentines Day, is to embark on a 5-week marriage challenge. Each week I want to encourage you to come by the Care & Counseling Corner before or after the morning service and pick up the week's marital exercise. Let me assure you! It will be doable!!
