

We are so thankful that you have chosen to worship with us today. If you are visiting let me welcome you and ask that you please fill out a Connection card found in the pew and return it to an usher at some point today. On January 22, 1973, the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion-on-demand in all 50 states. Since that time, over 60,000,000 innocent children have been murdered under the banner of "Choice". It is a deep conviction of Second Baptist that all life, from the moment of conception, bears the image of God and is worthy of protection. Each life that has been taken through the evil of abortion bore a distinct DNA that had never existed and will never exist again. This week we saw the state of New York move to legislate abortion availability to within moments of delivery. This tragic law has stirred the nation but in reality nothing has changed. You see a child aborted at 9 weeks is equally as valuable as a child aborted at 39 weeks. Our righteous anger toward abortion must remain constant. I'm not interested in moderating abortion, rather I want to end it. The laws regarding abortion in the state of Tennessee mock the sanctity of life in the exact same ways as those of New York. So what must we do? Let me suggest four things we can do.

First, I would encourage you to consider helping local crisis pregnancy centers. Through your faithful tithes we are able to support two distinct pregnancy centers in our region. We are thankful for the work of both Agape House in Martin, as well as LifeBeat in Tiptonville. You can also make designated gifts to one of these specific locations or split it among both.

Second, beyond our support for those centers, pray for legal intervention. I have spent years fighting for legislation and constitutional amendments in states like Mississippi. Serving on the advisory board of Personhood Mississippi, I came to see the front line fight for life in the political arena. Therefore, I would encourage you to get involved here in our great state seeking to abolish child genocide.

Third, one of the great challenges in our community is in the area of foster children. The Bible calls us to be Pro Life, not just Pro Baby. If you would be interested in helping foster a child, the Tennessee Baptist Children's Home will be offering PATH classes and training at First Baptist Martin during the month of February. These classes are required by the state for all foster families. If you would like more information, please email me this week at jhiens@secondbaptistuc.com.

Finally, the greatest weapon in our arsenal is the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The world rejects the laws of God as foolish. Man-made laws are temporary stop gaps to a bigger problem. Until mankind sees the value of life as given by God in Jesus Christ they will never value the life He creates. This is why we are committed to taking the good news into dark places like New York City so that the gospel would change lives and in turn, the perspective of an entire state.

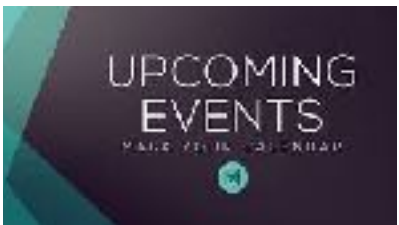
