FROM THE PASTOR

In a year of unexpected setbacks and cancellations, I should not be surprised that the last newsletter of 2020 would be about setbacks and cancellations. Last night, Governor Lee shared his concerns with the residents of Tennessee regarding the level of Covid infections across our state. I have found myself on the phone since last night discussing the implications of his address and mandate with others. So let me share with you what this means for Second Baptist Church.

First and foremost, the mandate of limiting social gatherings to no more than 10 people is not applicable to the gathering of worship. Within that same order was the directive that high school sports can continue with certain restrictions, while still allowing more than 10 people to be in attendance. We WILL continue to provide a safe, socially distanced and sanitized environment for anyone to worship in on Sundays and Wednesdays. We will continue to ask that masks be worn entering, exiting and moving around the building. However, when you have reached your seat, due to the social distance parameters, you are free to remove it. Despite over 100 members having had the virus, we have never been able to track someone getting it at the church. We thank God for this, and believe that it is the result of common sense policy and your cooperation.

While our worship will continue, in light of the current levels of Covid cases and the governor's mandate, we must pause our plans to restart LifeGroups until the end of January at the earliest. While these plans are always tentative, we are still disappointed when forced to adjust. While a class with less than 10 could potentially meet in a properly spaced room, the vast majority of our classes are more than 10. We are still left with difficult questions regarding children/youth ministry and how to move forward in those areas due to the continuation of open schools. I can assure you that the upcoming decisions regarding those ministries will be made with both facts and wisdom in the coming weeks.

The bottom line is, we are still in the midst of a pandemic. While early in this process, we saw only the highlights of Covid's effects on other places. The last few months has seen it hit close to home. A few people think the mask policy we have implemented is unnecessary. Some believe the continual delay of our complete regathering is an overreaction. But let's look at the facts for us in Obion County. 1 in every 450 residents of Obion County has died due to Covid. That rate is positioning us to possibly lead the state in overall death rate. To compare, that is nearly double the rate for Weakly County and nearly triple the rate for Shelby County (Memphis). I don't state those things to cast fear into you, but to help enlighten the seriousness of the problem. We continue to encourage those who are at risk to remain at home and worship virtually. For those who are not at risk, we ask that you continue being mindful of the issue and help meet these guidelines when we gather in worship.

Despite all of these setbacks, God continues to show up and show out. Sunday was probably one of the best services we have had in 6 months. I pray that spirit continues through the holidays and into the new year. Please know that I will be praying for you and can't wait to hear all that God does in my absence. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!!!
