One of the key realities in all these things is money to accomplish them. Let me encourage you to faithfully give your tithes and offerings each week. I know that many are traveling during this summer season but join me in committing to stay faithful in your giving and in your service. While on paper we are behind in our budget, I would simply remind you that last year was the largest single increase in our budget history. It was a step of faith in excess of \$91,000. In light of this, I will remind you that we are on track to take in the largest undesignated offering in our church's 65 year history. Let us thank God for such blessings and continue to faithfully steward all that he has entrusted to us individually and corporately as the body of Christ.


